GROSSES GEWÄCHS

VDP.GROSSE LAGE distinguishes the highest quality German vineyards. This is where the best wines with a complex taste, expressive location character and special aging potential mature. The locations are carefully selected by the VDP regional associations determined and precisely demarcated.

Vineyard

In Dernau, the Ahr valley widens after its bottlenecks and offers space for a steep valley basin in which the Pfarrwingert lies. The name of the vineyard goes back to the Catholic parish church in Dernaus, which is still the landowner in this piece of land. The particularly favorable southern exposure and slope, in combination with the easily warmable soil, result in a favorable microclimate in this location. This one occurring greywacke is a granular debris sediment with clay slate fragments to form a sandstone-like structure. The Pfarrwingert brings extremely fragrant wines with subtle fruit and fine spice pronounced minerality.

Winemaking

Old vines, careful vineyard work, consistent yield reduction and careful hand-picking. Harvest of the fully ripe, multiple selected grapes, at a Yield of approx. 30 hl/ha, gentle processing, matured in barriques at a Storage time of approx. 16 months (70% new wood) and subsequent 6 months bottle storage.

The Wine

This wine is characterized by the aroma of black cherries, wild blackberries, ripe raspberries and blueberries. This intense fruit is underlined by spicy components, delicate roasted aromas and violets. On the tongue it appears full-bodied with a long finish and an elegant tannin structure.

ANALYSE:

Alcohol: 13,5 % vol.

Residual Sugar: 0,4 g/l
