About the Winery

For centuries, our family has been making wine along the Rhine on the legendary Grand Cru sites of the famed Roter Hang. Working with warm Rheinhessen vineyards that range from steep to steeper, we are proud to cultivate biodynamic Riesling and Pinot Noir on organic-certified sites in the dry-farmed landscape between Bodenheim and Oppenheim. Since 2006, I have managed my family estate together with my husband. I'm a nature lover, oenologist, businesswoman and mother of two.

Vintage Notes

Truly, 2018 is a special year. In Rheinhessen, the year began with a humid and relatively warm January, followed by a cold, wintry February and lots of rain in March. Due to the lack of morning fog and the dryness, we will not have any of the filigree Riesling Auslesen with the 2018 vintage, as the 2017 vintage gave us, for example. But we rate the 2018 vintage as a great "dry" vintage - the wines have enormous strength.

Tasting Notes

Starbright and shimmering in shades of pale yellow, and, when given time in the glass, overflowing with delicate stone fruits suggestive of Mirabelle plum and apricot. Joined by the herbal aromas of green tea and spring kitchen herbs such as chervil and young ginger. The next aromatic wave reveals origin with the unmistakable markers of Rotflügelnde in the form of white pepper, arisa, and rusty steel. The nose is
